RE: Announcing the Faculty Foundations Course

Beginning January 2026, the Perelman School of Medicine Office of Academic Affairs will offer Faculty Foundations, a course that provides information and skills-based practice to support success at reappointment and promotion, promote a healthy and safe environment for learners and interdisciplinary teams, and contribute to a feedback-rich culture.

Assistant Professors on all four full-time faculty tracks, Academic Clinician, Clinician Educator, Research, and Tenure, are *required* to complete Faculty Foundations. The course is also *highly recommended* for new faculty appointed at the rank of Associate Professor or Professor.

At the conclusion of the course, faculty will receive an email with a completion certificate. We recommend you save a copy of the certificate for your records. For faculty at the rank of Assistant Professor, this certificate must be included in their first reappointment dossier.

<u>Faculty Foundations can be accessed at any time via Canvas</u>. For faculty without a Canvas account, one can be created by emailing Canvas Support (see below) your name, email, and pennkey.

## **Faculty Foundations Course Components include the following:**

- **Module One:** The Digital Welcome provides essential information for remaining in good standing as a faculty member at the Perelman School of Medicine. (~45 Min)
- **Module Two:** Fostering Healthy, Safe, and Productive Environments for Your Learners and Team. (~20 Min)
- Module Three: Designing Goals and Objectives for Your Learners and Team. (~20 Min)
- Module Four: The Art of Providing Effective Feedback to Learners and Your Team (~30 Min)

This program replaces the **Onboarding for Teaching Program**.
